Subject: Florida Career College (#349400) – Voluntary Withdrawal of Accreditation

Pursuant to the Council on Occupational Education (COE) Policies and Rules and 34 Code of Federal Regulations §602.26(f)(1), COE provides written notice to the U.S. Secretary of Education, the appropriate State licensing or authorizing agencies, the appropriate accrediting organizations, and the public, within ten business days, when an accredited or preaccredited institution or program decides to voluntarily withdraw from accreditation.

The Council on Occupational Education received Florida Career College’s January 22, 2024, request to voluntarily withdraw from COE’s membership, effective February 16, 2024.

Given the nature of this request, the institution is subject to following through with their closure and teach-out plan (Handbook of Accreditation: 2024 Edition, Section V. B., 1m. Closure and Section V. B., 1n. Teach-Out) and (Handbook of Accreditation: 2024 Edition, Section V, A., 8. Voluntary Withdrawal of Status, page 28-29).
